Building Bridges

As we sent out our last letter, Hammy Agnew was coming from Northern Ireland. In spite of very warm weather and severe migraine headaches, Hammy completed three quarters of the plastering on the outside of the house, as well as doing a large inside wall. Not only do we thank him for his hard work but also Mr & Mrs Kenneth Hughes who made his trip possible.

Hammy came with us on a trip to F.Y.R.O.Macedonia, and gave his testimony in one of the meetings where David was preaching, during which he had the added experience of his first earthquake. The building was rocked by the quake, which with its epicenter in the nearby mountains, measured 5.7 on the Richter scale and was felt from Thessalonica in Greece to Sofia in Bulgaria. David says, it is not often people have such an earth shaking experience while he is preaching as he reminded them of Acts 16 at Philippi! God is still in control!

Strengthening Old Bridges

A few weeks later David and our next door neighbour, in even hotter temperatures, finished off the final outside wall of the house. Kostas, who was glad of the paid work, can only speak Greek, so it proved good for David's language skills. Several neighbours dropped by for coffee and a chat, which although not conducive to fast progress, gave good openings for sharing and giving out literature.

Two ladies, both Mary, from N. Ireland passed through Greece to help Jimmy in his work in Stip. They had been in F.Y.R.O.Macedonia with Ministry for Europe Trust last year, and returned on their own steam, wanting especially to help poor children. We were able to assist, by taking them from the airport to the Macedonian border, where Jimmy met them, and we repeated the journey in reverse two weeks later.

Developing New Bridges

This summer we made many more trips than originally planned, but through these have gotten to know new fellowships, new friends and new locations. Olive Wilson took us to a recently started and growing Romany Fellowship, where David had a chance to share with Olive translating and we have been invited back. We came into contact with a group of believers in Prilep and were able to encourage them in their work.

Our visits to Bitola have been bitter-sweet as some personality friction is causing severe hurt and straining friendships past breaking point. The evil one is always on the lookout to cause division and sometimes God's people are extremely gullible, falling repeatedly into his traps. An absence of leadership encouraged this situation to escalate. Please pray for







wisdom as these situations are being dealt with.

However, there is growth in the fellowship and souls continue to come in with questions, not only to the meetings but also to the English classes and the Café run on the premises. We renewed fellowship with **Marin and his family** who were visiting from Bulgaria and are also keen for us to come and help them in Sofia.

Water under the Bridge

We will return to Bitola for the Baptism of **Zhaklina and possibly others** on September 6th. Pray for her as she invites some of her wider family circle to witness the event.

We had mentioned in PL 100 that **Ethan and Jan** were expecting their first child, which sadly due to a miscarriage, is no longer the case. However, they are both doing well and in a very positive way have left the future with the Lord. Due to a change in Macedonian visa rules, they are being forced to return to the USA until it becomes possible for them to get more permanent entrance into the country.

One exciting opportunity developed when several different missionary groups joined together for a huge open air meeting on the beach at Leptokarya.. Hundreds listened to the singing, testimonies and preaching from God's Word. One **young muslim convert** showed where he had been stabbed in the heart by his fanatical best friend in Iran, following his conversion. This led to many questions and much literature being taken.

Recently, we were invited by the local village president, to the **annual festival** remembering their escape from Turkey into Greece in the 1820's when thousands were slaughtered mercilessly by their tyrannical overlords. It was nice to chat with many of the locals and experience the continued friendliness of the local orthodox priest.

We have enjoyed working with the Revival movement, from Belfast (formerly Every Home Crusade) and have prayed for their ministry for decades as through their work untold thousands have learned God's wonderful plan of Salvation. Our combined work has led to personal discussions with all of the delivery people and several office personnel. Recently, **Eugenia and Barbara** requested further meetings to discuss the literature they received.

Bridges in need of Repair

Last month, we cut short a trip to attend the wedding of an evangelical friend, who was marrying an orthodox 'good boy' as her mother describes him. Please pray that this trend will slow down, as the desire to marry takes pre-eminence over God's call for separation. Not only the youth are at fault, as many parents believe that an unequal marriage is better than no marriage and no grandchildren. There needs to be a complete change in their attitude towards those still single and waiting for the 'right' partner. We received a letter from a friend, burdened for Greece who lists Greece as being the neediest missionfield in Europe. Even if it is not exactly top of the list, we need wisdom to use the best approach in helping the believers grow in their faith, and your prayers to reach the lost. There are occasions when we tangibly feel God is in control concerning timing and conversation. A chance phone call - 15 minutes later 3 strangers at our door - during conversation, two of the strangers hint that we can't expect much of another contact, who is 'not involved in church like us'. Following David's question regarding when their own personal destiny was secured, it was discovered that we were dealing with a deeply troubled man who spent decades running from God and a wife carrying burdens and pressures God never intended. Tears were shed and over the next two hours they admitted the need to allow God into their lives.

Hours later, another friend **Chris**, with whom David has also spent many hours in discussion, called, stating that his brother-in-law told him about a discussion they had, and Chris knew immediately who had spoken with them. We had no idea they were related and the family were in total amazement at how small the world is. Why are we so surprised when the God of miracles does something? Please pray – God is at work in this family.

Pray also, please, for **Wilma's sister Catherine**, who is being treated for epileptic fits of an unknown origin, and for her family as they adjust to this diagnosis. **David's brother lan, Jacqueline and son Harry** spent two weeks here in August, mixing holiday with work. Ian did a great job painting the large room, hallways, and the outside preparation coat, which was done in a couple of days of extreme heat here. Jackie and Harry, not only





assisted lan, but also undertook many tasks from scraping plaster off gates and railings to painting radiators and interior doors. During one of their short trips to the beach, lan heard a lady calling desperately for help. Without a pause for thought, he guickly swam over, assessed the situation and carried her disabled adult daughter into the shore. The mother was very grateful to lan for his quick reaction. It was nice for us to spend time with them and we were able to go to Gevgelija, giving them opportunity to meet some of the believers there.

Ali & Vicki, from England, also want to mix holiday with work and we look forward to their visit in early Sept. There have been many guests and callers this summer and also good contact with neighbours who only come to the village for the summer. Pray for these **continued friendships** to develop into more.

Across the Bridge

After a successful career as a midwife, Helen Sunter became mission secretary for the UF in Scotland, and so began our friendship. Among other missionary trips, Helen visited Macedonia, helping the clinic in Skopje and also visited Leptokarya camp, where she reported on the church in Scotland.
