Dear Friends,

We returned recently from visiting the family in the States, and celebrated, two Births, Thanksgiving, six Birthdays (including especially Christmas, Jesus birthday), New Year, Baby Dedication, President's inauguration and Super bowl!! Not to mention the four Advent Sundays when we had friends and family take part in an informal time in our home, reunions with the students and church folks who came out to Greece, as well as meetings with friends old and new allowing opportunities to share the work and the Word. All in all, it was a great experience and there was certainly no time for boredom!! We thank very sincerely all those who took us out to eat, came to spend time with us, or who did anything else to make our stay more enjoyable. Special thanks to those folks whom we know pray for us regularly.

We were very thankful to live in a beautiful home provided by Thomas Road Baptist church, which was constantly filled with family, friends, fellowship and lots of food while we were there. Someone on seeing the house quipped that *'you would almost be willing to leave heaven and come here for the weekend.'* They also provided us with a car to get us around and this was an added blessing. It was a thrill to be part of the church fellowship and see the work growing, in the church, schools and university. One of the challenges facing the church is integrating new believers in to the body, by making sure they fit into cell groups which meet their needs. Iain is responsible for much of this work, as well as continuing working in the Men's ministry. We were astounded and excited to see definite growth in many fellowships in the area, and realise this is only possible through the Lord blessing fervent prayer. To this end there was a special weekend conference on prayer we were able to attend with Peter Lord as the main speaker.

Allyn, gave his bedroom at home to a friend who needed to stay for a while and moved in with us, which was an extra blessing, as we got to spend a lot more time with him than previously expected. This semester he has been promoted to Assistant Director of Introductory Communications, meaning he is responsible for the day to day help needed by the 16 instructors in the program, while still teaching his own classes. We were often told of the influence he has had on the lives of numerous people and the mentoring he does for so many lads. He enjoys it all very much but needs guidance for his future and we ask you to pray with us that the Lord will clarify the next step for him. We need to do the MOT etc and replenish our trailer with medical and other supplies before our return.

In the last letter we told you **Ethan & Jan** had returned for family reasons and Jan's mother went to be with the Lord in December. They were so glad to have been able to spend these months with her and now to be with her father for this time, before returning to Bitola on the 11th March. We look forward to getting back with all of them.

Retracing the Steps

The tour coming to Greece in April is full and **Thomas Jennings**, leader of MET, who is to share with David the Bible teaching would appreciate concentrated, believing prayer for his health at this time. The tour group will have three nights in a hotel near Thessaloniki, during which time they will visit **Thessaloniki** and worship with believers there. **Philippi, Amfissa and Neapolis** are also on the agenda during these days. Following a visit to **Berea and Vergina**, they will come to our home and spend the night in our locality. The next morning we journey to Athens taking time off to see the great scenery of **Meteora** etc and stay 3 nights in a hotel between Athens and Corinth. From there we will tour **Athens, Corinth, Delphi** and various other sites, before flying out on Sat 18th April from Athens. We trust not only that the people will be refreshed as they walk where Paul walked, but that they will have an insight into the spiritual needs of the Greek peoples and remember the work in prayer.
